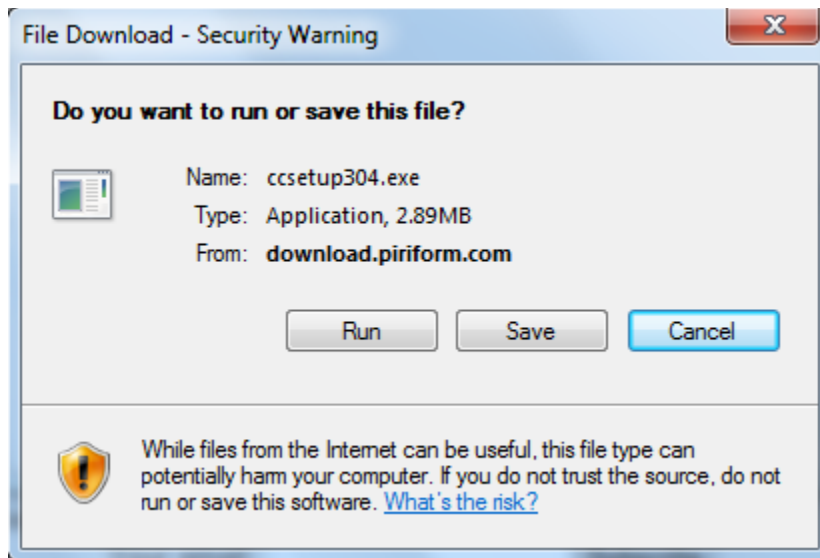

Installation, Setup and Configuration:

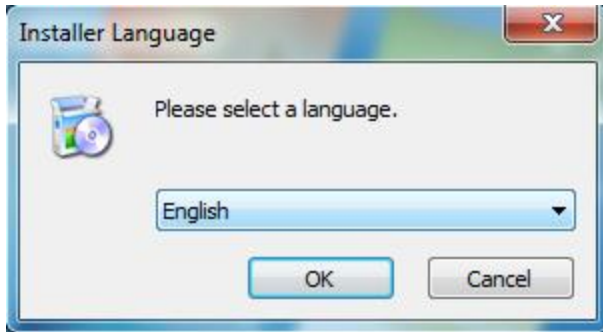
CCleaner is an all in one freeware system optimization and privacy tool. It removes unused junk files on your system, in turn allowing Windows to run faster. It also can clean your online internet history. CCleaner is designed to be safe and easy to use. It has multiple levels of checks to ensure that you won't delete any useful information or documents you still need.

Installation

To download CCleaner, go to <http://download.piriform.com/ccsetup304.exe>.



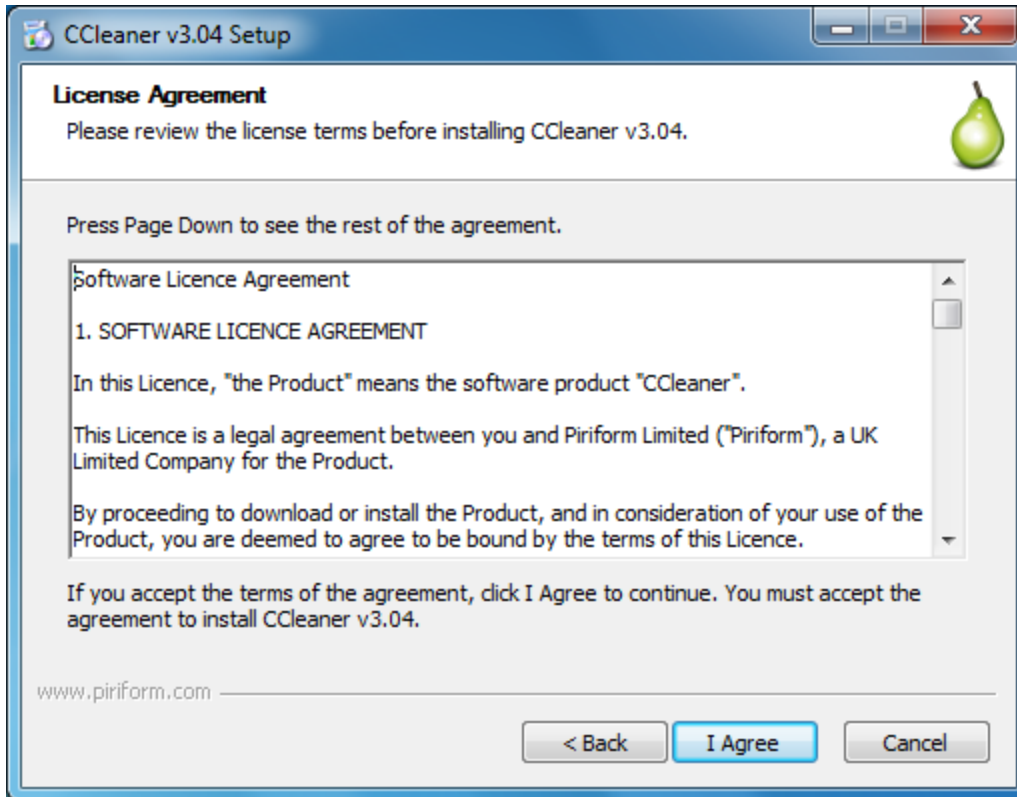
Click "Run" or "Save", this is your choice if you would like to save the install file or just temporarily have the file.



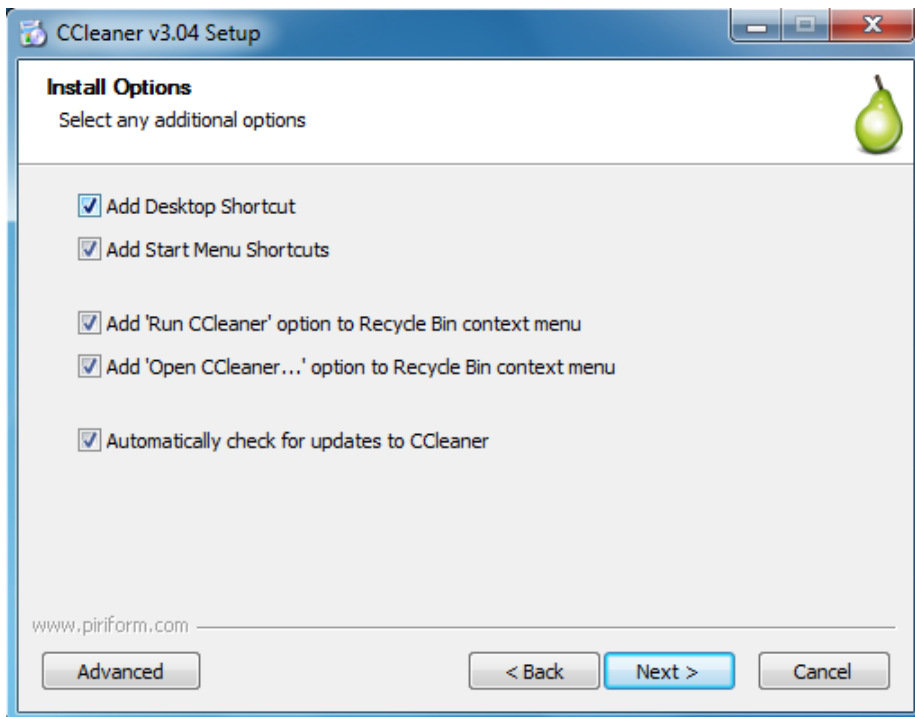
Select your language and click "OK"



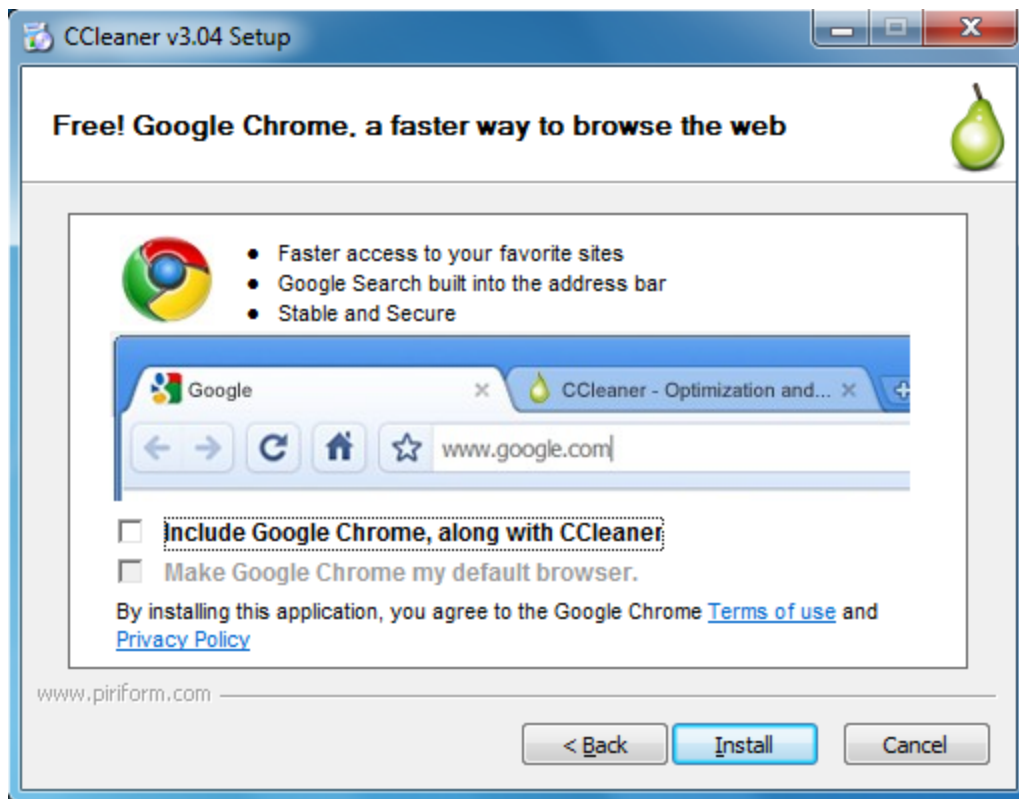
Click "Next >."



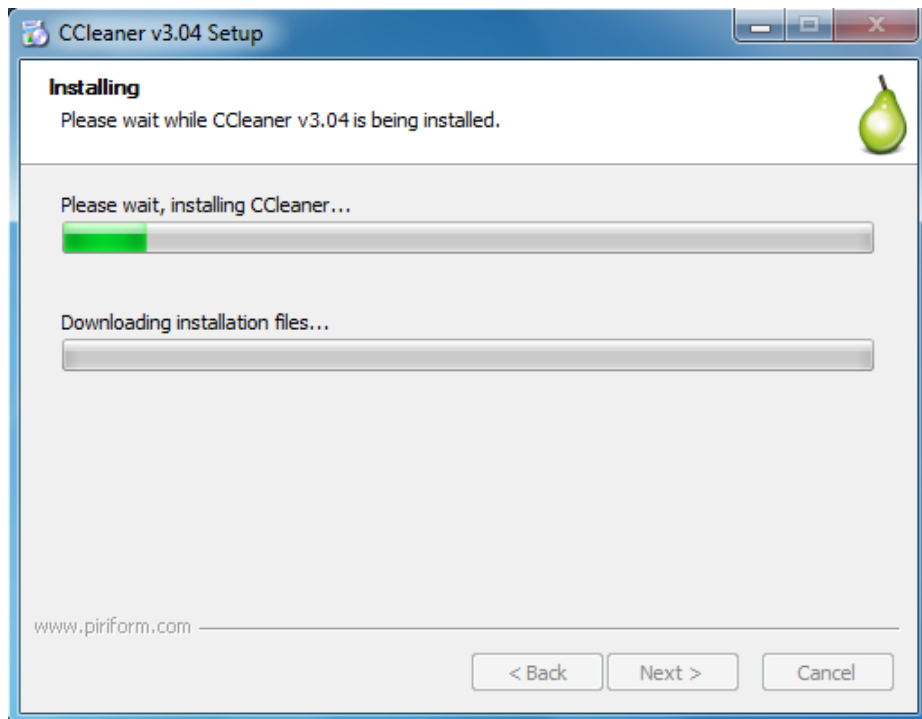
Click "I Agree."



Select the options you wish to install and click "NEXT >." We recommend leaving all the checkboxes marked.



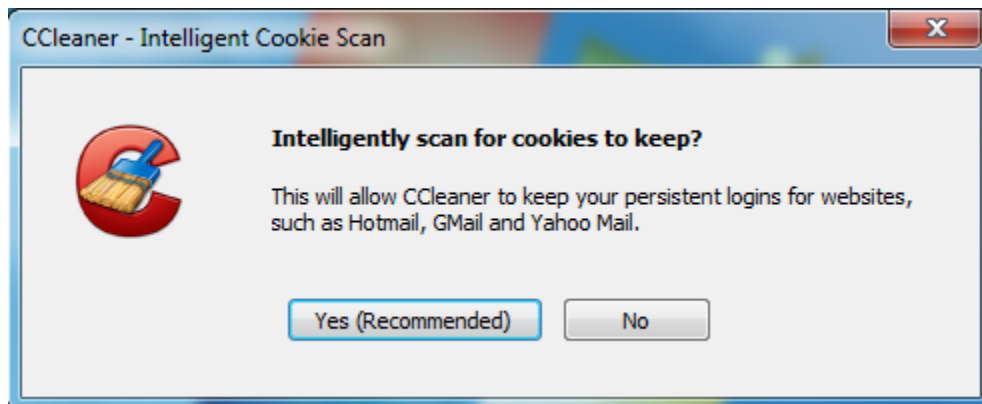
Unless you would like to install Google Chrome, uncheck the boxes and click "Install."



CCleaner will now install.

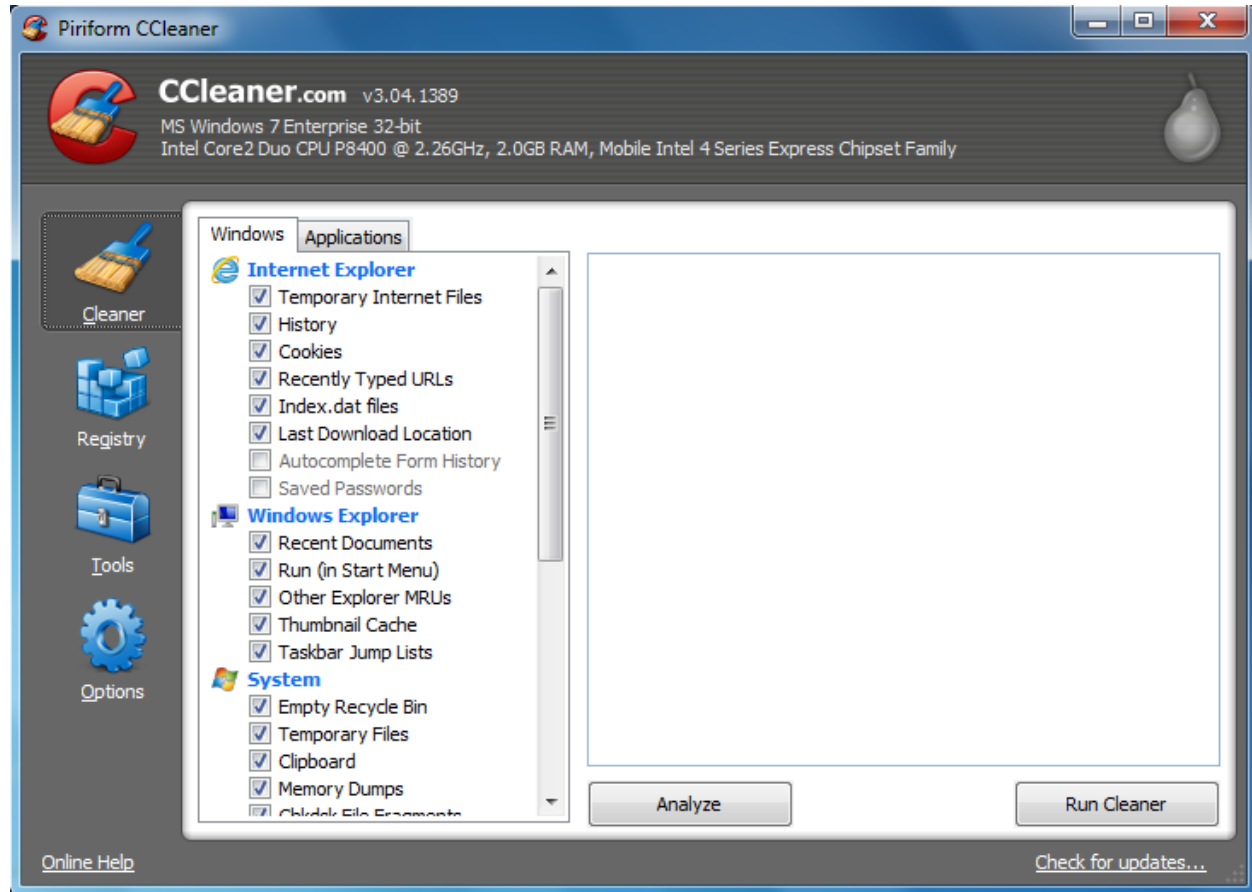


Click "Finish."

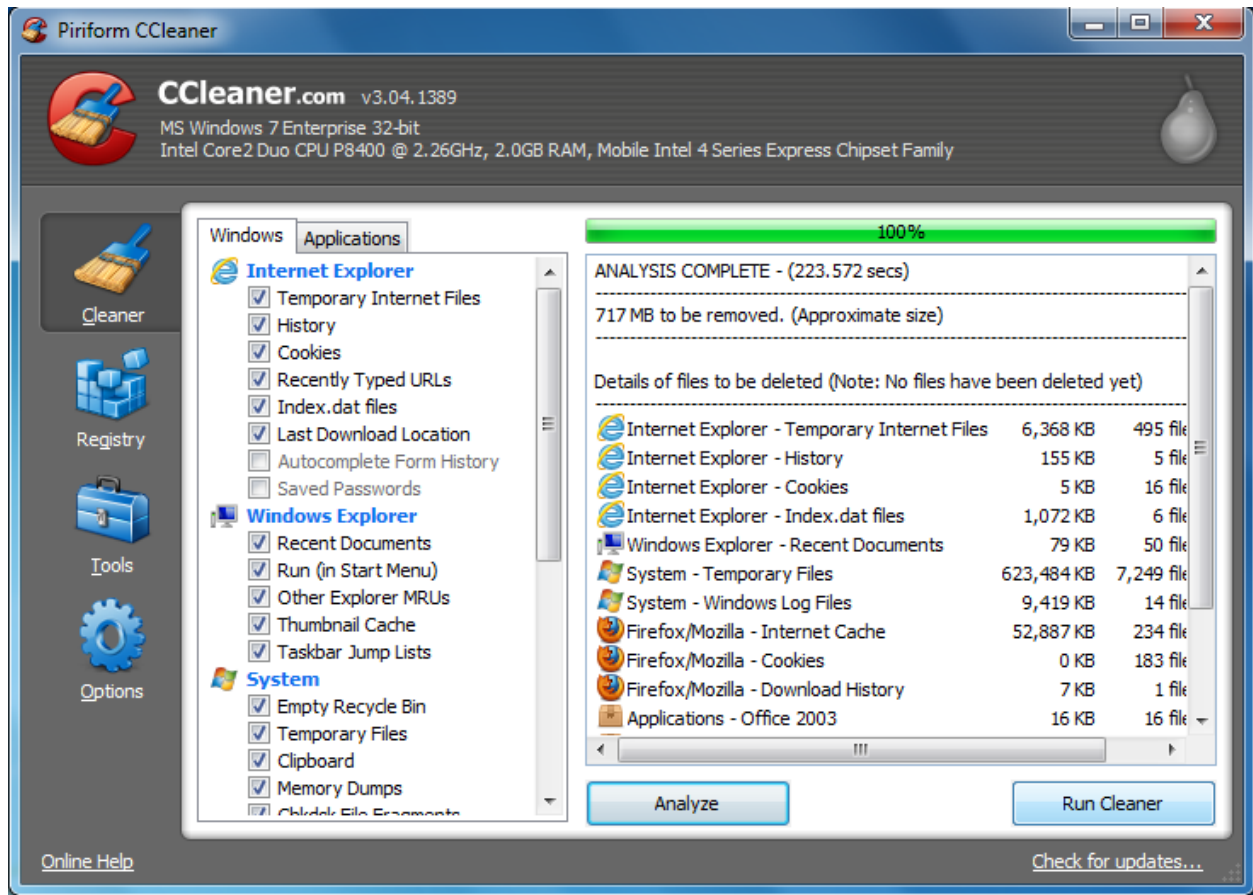


Click "Yes (Recommended)" so that important cookies on your computer do not get erased.

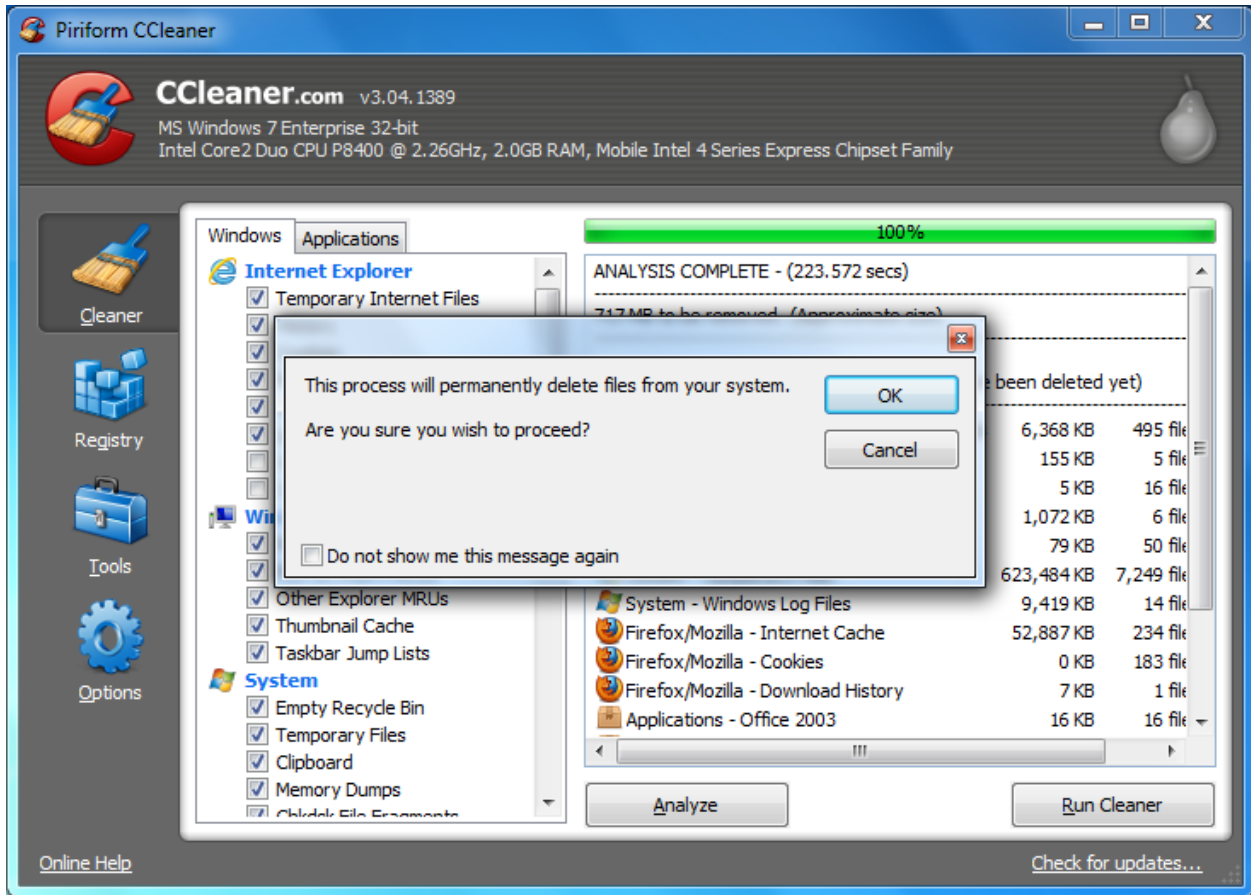
File Cleaner



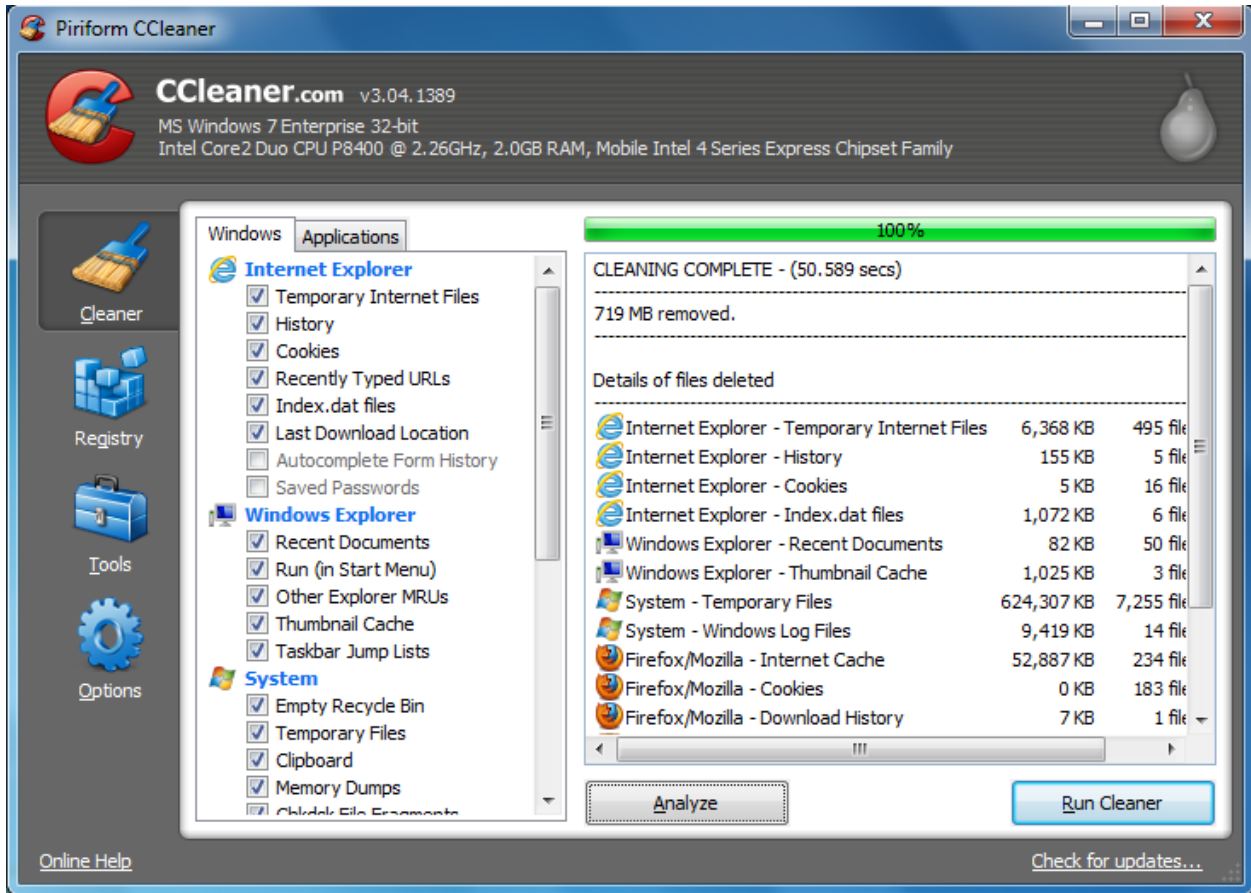
For general scanning, we recommend that users use the default selections. If checked, many of the options can erase important information. Click "Analyze" when you are ready to clean your computer. This will scan your computer for potential files to be erased.



Once done analyzing, CCleaner will display a report of the files it will remove. It is good idea to examine the list to make sure there is nothing you wish to have deleted. If there is something in the list you wish to not to delete, you can uncheck it and reanalyze. Once you have the files you wish to delete ready, click "Run Cleaner."



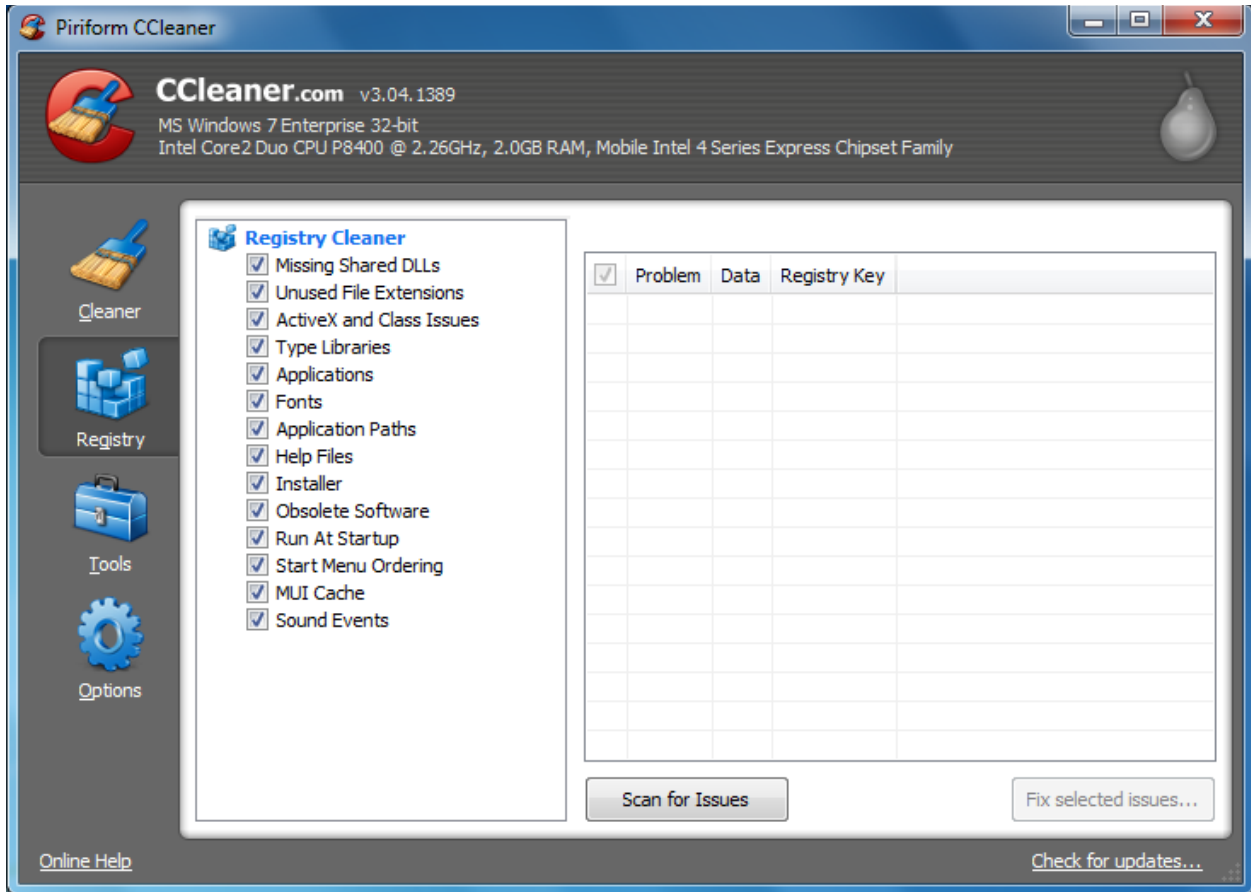
You will receive a pop up confirming the deletion of the files. If you are sure you wish to delete the files, click "OK."



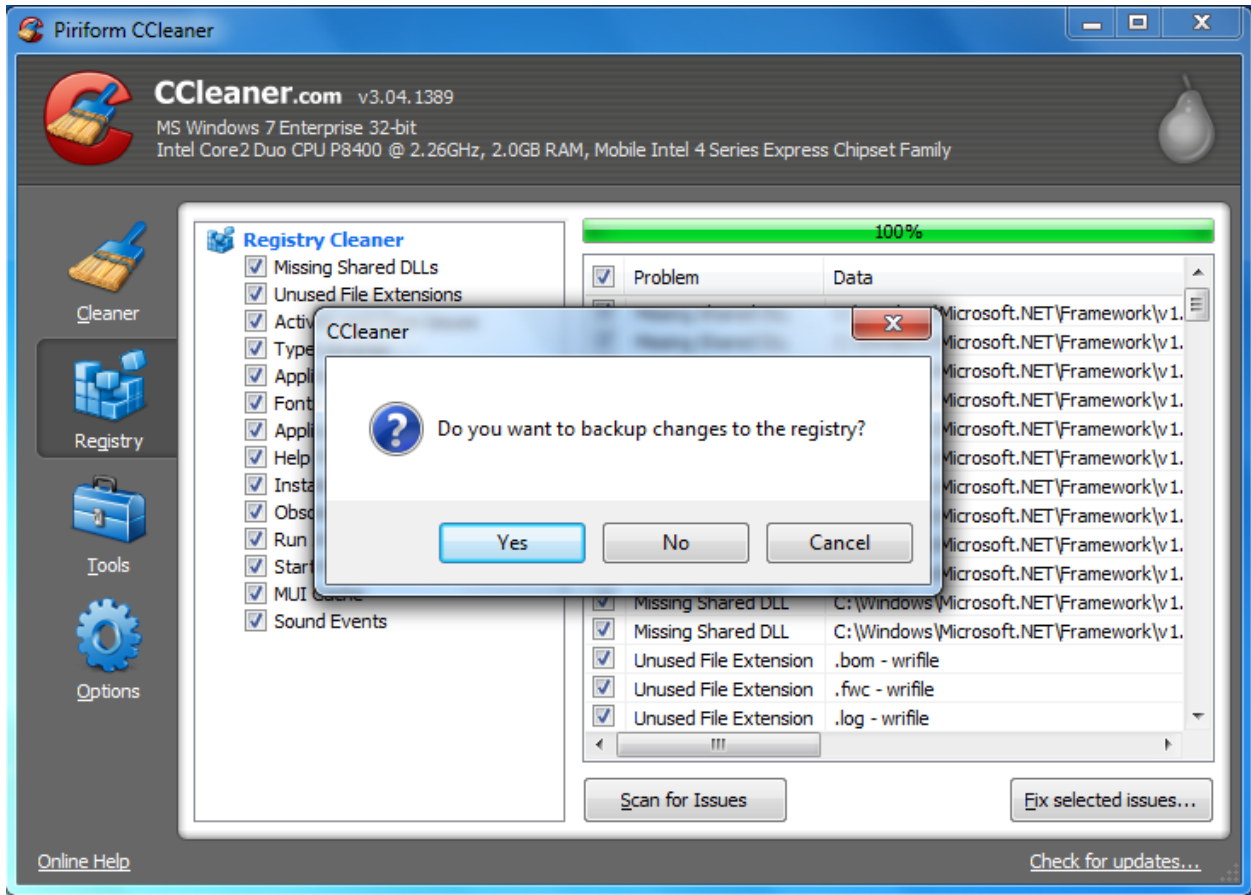
After CCleaner has completed, it will display a report of the deleted files and the amount of space cleared up.

Registry Cleaner

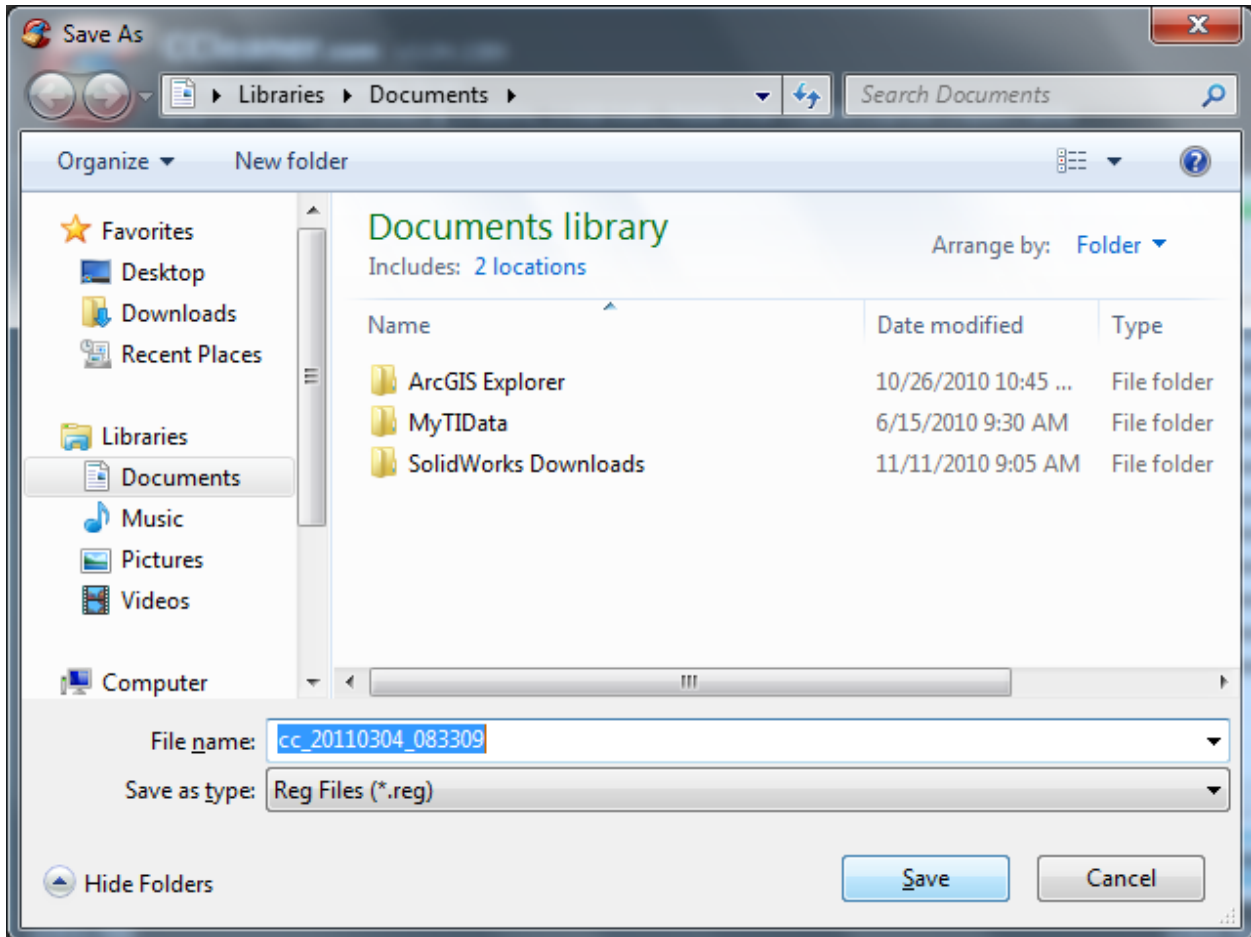
Another great feature in CCleaner is its Registry Cleaner. To scan the registry for issues, click “Registry” on the left column and then click “Scan for Issues.”



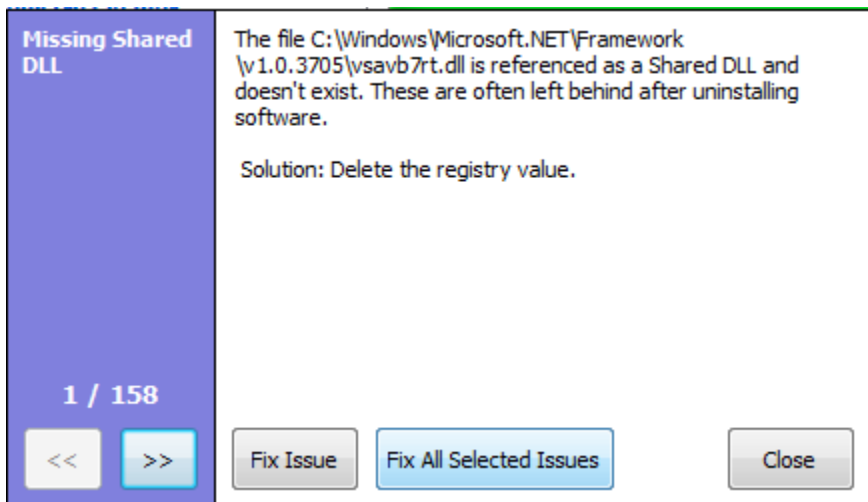
Once it is done scanning, it will display the results on the right hand column. You can choose what issues to fix by selecting/deselecting the check boxes before and after the scan. Once you have reviewed the issues, you can click “Fix selected issues...”



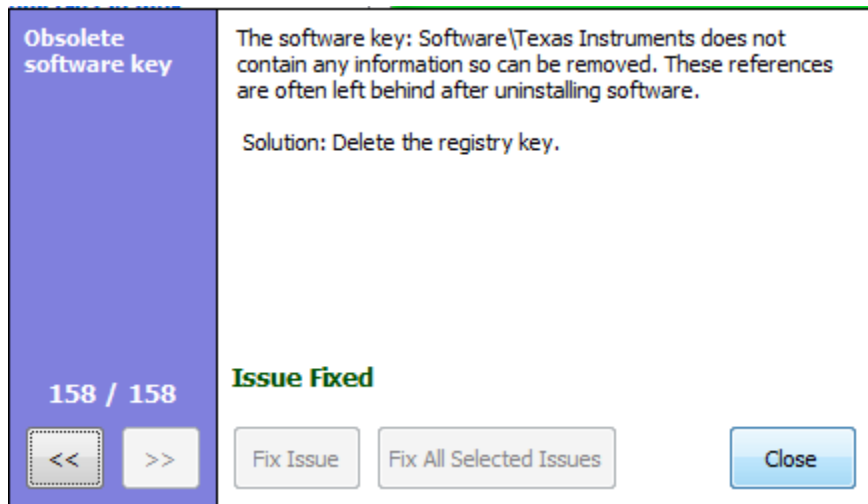
You will be asked to back up your registry. It is highly recommend that you do so that if there are any issues you can restore the registry. If you wish to backup your registry, click "Yes." If you do not want to back up your registry, but continue with the process, click "No." If you wish not to fix your registry, click "Cancel."



If you selected to back it up, you will be prompted asking where to save your registry file. Once you have navigated to the folder you wish to save to, click “Save”.

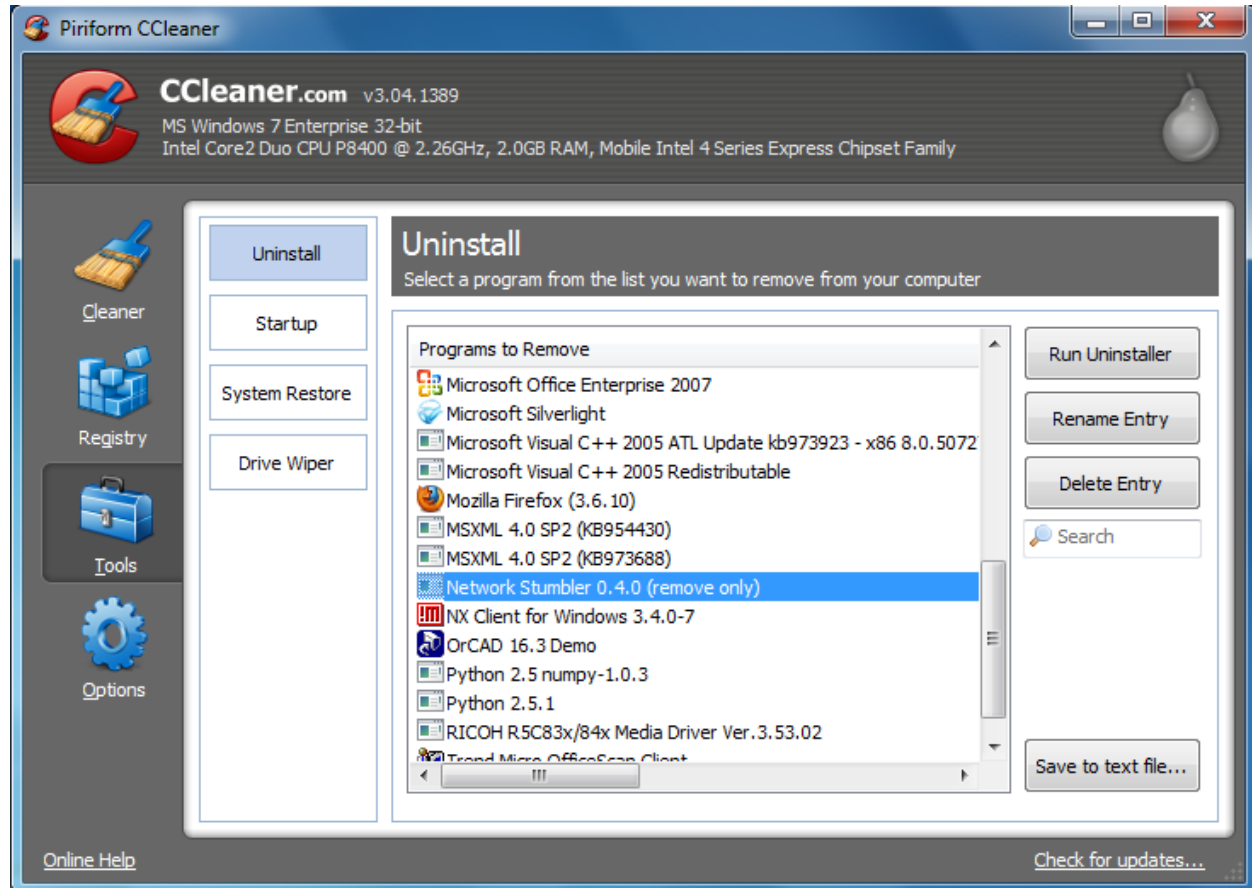


You can now go through and review all the issues and choose whether or not to fix them. If you are comfortable in what the program has chosen to fix, you can click “Fix All Selected Issues” and it will fix and remove them from the registry.



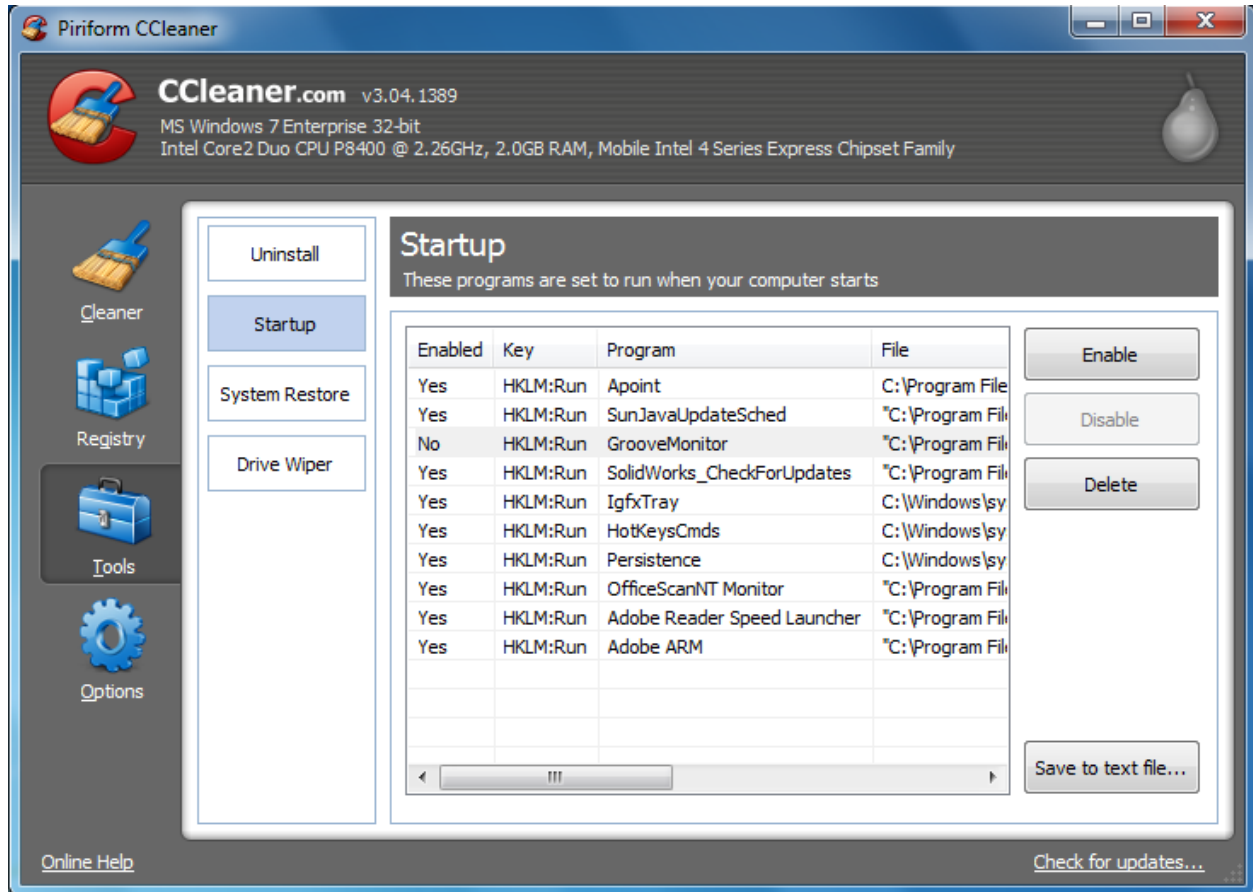
Once you are done fixing your registry issues, click “Close”.

Uninstalling Programs



CCleaner also includes an uninstaller. This will allow you to directly uninstall programs and edit the same values that appear in the "Add/Remove Programs" list in the Windows Control Panel. To uninstall a program, select which program you wish to uninstall, and then click "Run Uninstaller".

Editing Startup Programs



CCleaner can also help you control what programs start when you start your computer. To choose whether a program should be enabled or disabled on start up, select the program out of the list, then if you wish to disable it from starting up, click "Disable." If you wish for a program to run on startup, click "Enable."
